Framework legislation – specific product requirements to be set at a second stage

****Regularly updated multiannual working plans** – based on prioritisation criteria set out in Article 16**

Detailed measures

On a product-by-product basis, or based on groups of similar Products, preceded by detailed impact assessment

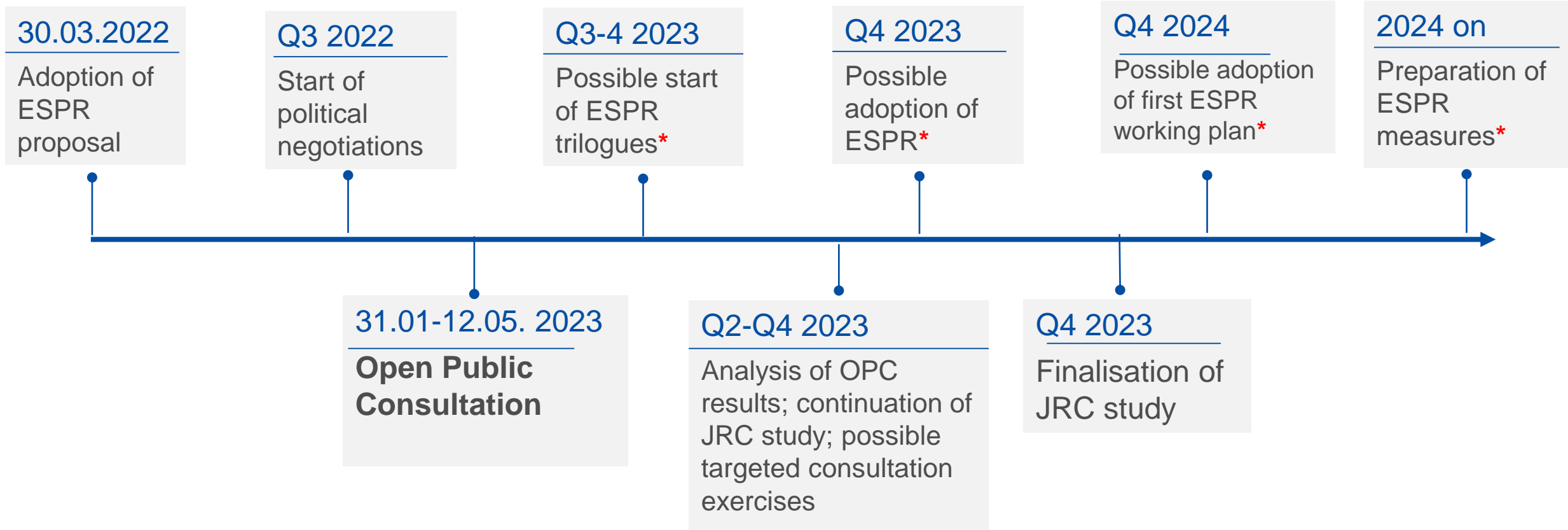


OPC: objectives of consultation



- Preliminary assessment conducted by the JRC → identification of a number of **products** and **horizontal measures** that may be suitable for first action under the ESPR. You can tell us:
 - Are these products/measures the **correct** ones to consider prioritising? Are we **missing any**?
 - In what **order of priority** should they be tackled?
 - What are the **most relevant aspect(s)** per product/horizontal measure to tackle?
 - What is the estimated **potential for improving** these products from an environmental point of view?
 - At **what level** should rules should be set per product group? (the so-called “granularity” question)
 - Relevant environmental and circularity information related to the **value chains and how they function**; how to best to ensure rules are **implementable and technical feasible**.
 - *Amongst other information*
